Job summary:

The VP of Community Engagement and Resources is accountable for providing highly collaborative, visionary, and strategic leadership to strengthen, revitalize, and improve access to high-quality educational systems and leverage assets and resources to best meet the needs of Native Hawaiian learners in the regions and communities where they live and are educated. The VP of Community Engagement and Resources has the authority and oversight to work collectively with community members, families, educators and others to achieve excellent shared educational and well-being outcomes for Native Hawaiian learners and families.

The VP of Community Engagement and Resources is accountable to drive organizational execution with clear results and urgency, leading to a high-performance culture. Such culture will be based on exceptionally productive, skilled, team-oriented staff who will deliver on division objectives that reflect Native Hawaiian identity, promote Hawaiian cultural vibrancy, and help improve the capability and well-being of people of Hawaiian ancestry.

Minimum requirements: *

- Master's degree in a field of business, education, social sciences or related field.
- 10 years of progressive management experience with 3 years at the senior management or executive level preferably in a similarly complex organization.
- Demonstrated leadership skills in community resources and engagement planning, operations, strategic planning, process improvement and change management.
- A proven track record of successful execution in a mission-driven, complex organization focused on both quantitative and qualitative outcomes and measures.
- Proven ability to successfully lead and influence a diverse group of service providers and community partners.

Preferred qualifications:

- Experience working and interacting with the Native Hawaiian community.
- Basic skills in ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi (Hawaiian language).
- Basic knowledge of Hawaiian history and culture.
