Course Descriptions

This year we are offering an **ADDITIONAL** elective choice during Period 8! Each trimester, you may select one of the following pass/fail courses to expand your learning opportunities based on what interests you. These classes fall in the last block of every even day and will be mixed-grade level, allowing you to interact with different peers and make new friends. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis, so submit your registration and get your parents to sign-off on your selections as quickly as possible!

3D Printing and Design - HM09006

Learn how to design functional objects, sculpture, and other digitally inspired forms, using 3D applications. You will encounter a variety of Design Challenges that will tackle global waste, solve engineering issues, put you in the role of entrepreneurs, and more!

Admit One - HM09007

Get a taste of the ins and outs of musical theatre. Play theatre games, watch musicals, and work on props and sets for upcoming Kula Waena productions. This class will give haumāna the opportunity to experience the many facets of musical theatre, both on stage and behind the scenes.

'Āina 2 'Ōpū - HM09010

This outdoor elective will explore all things 'āina: farming, gardening, reforestation, etc. on our campus and in our community. We will also harvest and enjoy the things we grow. Rain or Shine, we're out there! Come prepared with rain gear, a change of clothes, boots, and your best "self".

Articulate Art - HM09011

The Articulate Art course encourages students to express their creativity as they gain a foundation in traditional art forms and experiment with contemporary artistic practices. This course will offer various opportunities to beautify our campus and work on community projects. Painting, sculpture, mosaic, and contemporary materials will be included in the traditional art media. The class seeks to establish skills in crafts, design, painting, and other forms of visual expression. If you like art, enjoy working with others, are interested in learning new techniques, and want to kōkua in our community, then The Articulate Art course is for you. This course honors students who are in the National Junior Art Honor Society or would like to join.

Basic Woodworking - HM09012

Basic Woodworking is a course designed to introduce students to general woodworking practices. Students will expand their knowledge and experience through various projects and lessons. Students will be expected to learn about and safely use hand tools, power tools, and woodworking machinery.

Along the way, you will take part in regular Bible study, chapels, skits, music, competitions, and activities - geared toward growing you as a person created by God.

Lāhui Living - HM09015

In this class, haumāna will learn skills in cooking and food safety. We will use basic principles of science to help us better understand our food and where it comes from. Locally sourced food is always in season and ready for our creativity! Come experiment with us in our culinary lab.

Music Explorations - HM09016

Haumāna will be introduced to music theory, music history, composition, improvisation, musical movements, and a variety of musical instruments. Haumāna will also learn how music can further their understanding of their culture and relationships to other subjects.
