# Changes to the 2018-2019 SY

KSM will implement new approaches that aim to improve the student experience at KSM. We are expanding our school day which will allow for increased curriculum time to better prepare our haumāna for post high college and career success.

To implement this new approach the Middle and High School campuses will have NEW bell schedules.

The High School will start at 8:15 am and end at 3:20 pm on Monday through Friday.

The **Middle School** will start at 8:15 am and end at 3:20 pm on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Tuesday will begin at 8:15 am and end at 2:30 pm.

The **Elementary School** will remain the same, starting at 7:45 am and ending at 2:30 pm.

How can parents adapt to this new bell schedule? Although the HS and MS begin the school day at 8:15 am the BUSES WILL LEAVE AT THE SAME TIME and students will arrive on campus around 7:30 am.

- Students being driven to school may arrive on campus between 7:00 am 8:10 am
- High school student drivers may arrive between 7:00 am 8:00 am to accommodate the 8:15 am start time.

#### This seems like a longer day for my student even though school will begin at 8:15 am.

Yes, the school day will be longer by 20 minutes for Middle School and High School. There will be benefits to this new schedule such as services **BEFORE** the school day begins.

- Middle school students: All faculty will have office hours that allow students to seek help and/or an
  opportunity for parents to conference, Students will be able to have a Continental breakfast in the
  dining hall, Study Hall at Keanolani Learning Center, or socialize in the Music Room(s). All of these
  areas will be supervised by KSM staff.
- High School students: All faculty will have office hours that allow students to seek help and/or an
  opportunity for parents to conference. Breakfast in the dining hall and finishing projects in the
  Learning Center will be options for students.

There will be benefits to this new schedule such as services DURING the school day. Middle and High school students will have Intervention periods which will allow students that need to build foundational skills more support within the day. Enrichment classes will allow students to explore areas of interest and provide time to identify their passions. High school students will also have Study Hall imbedded in the school schedule and "block flexibility."

## Will there be other changes because of the new start times at Middle School and High School? Yes, because his transportation for Kibei and Labaina students is K-12, there will be changes for these

Yes, because bus transportation for Kīhei and Lāhainā students is K-12, there will be changes for these bus riders.

The Kīhei and Lāhainā bus will depart at 3:30 EVERY day.

- Elementary school bus riders the school will provide after school care Monday through Friday, 2:30 pm— 3:30 pm.
- Middle school bus riders the school will provide after school care on Tuesdays/early release, from 2:30 pm – 3:30 pm.

### Kula Ki'eki'e Schedule

The new schedule allows us to deliver curriculum, add enrichment classes, provide immediate intervention and offer a variation of the block time. Our goal is to create a structure in which students can realize their true potential as learners.

<u>Varied Blocks</u> The varied blocks provide flexibility on how the teacher plans out their curriculum. The 90 minute blocks allow for more project based activities, whereas the 70 minute block allows for more direct instruction. Combined, we feel it will provide for a more efficient use of time for both the teacher's instruction and the learner's capacity to absorb information.

**Enrichment** "E" Enrichment is an opportunity to expose our students to much more than the core curriculum. Enrichment classes allow students to explore who they are and what they are passionate about. Students will benefit from opportunities to build new skills and interests; develop self-confidence while providing cross-disciplinary, real-world learning opportunities that support core subjects. Teachers will have opportunities to receive professional development or to plan collaboratively. In addition, it allows gives teachers an opportunity to teach topics beyond the required curriculum. Community partners and networks: Enrichment will increase access to underutilized community partners and networks and strengthen the connections between the school and community. More importantly it improves school climate as it strengthens relationships between students and adults. \*resource from www.timeandlearning.org

<u>Intervention</u> "I" An instructional intervention is a specific program or set of steps to help a student improve in an area of need. Students will have opportunities for immediate feedback and assistance during the school day. Teachers will be provided with opportunities to reengage learners who may need additional time to receive immediate and consistent feedback on content. Most importantly, intervention will counter the "wait to fail" situation because students get help promptly within the general education setting. As soon as assessment data indicates a problem area for a student or a group of students, interventions are put into place to address these concerns.

Imbedded Study Hall A high schooler's life is busy! With the new graduation requirements, the grade 9 and 10 Seminar classes were phased out. With the newly imbedded Study Hall period, it allows us the opportunity to continue to deliver our Christian and Guidance curriculum (non-credited graduation requirement), but also provide an open space for students to have some time within the school day to prepare/complete assignments for the week or seek assistance from teachers. In addition to valuing the "home life", we also understand the importance of students getting a good night's rest.

#### Kula Waena Schedule

The 2018-19 refreshed Kula Waena schedule reflects what we value and is realized through a 20 minute increase in the instructional day for students AND also initiates a later start time. This means that our students will begin their day at 8:15 am and end at 3:20 pm; every Tuesday students will be dismissed at 2:30 pm to allow faculty & staff to meet as a middle school unit. This schedule reflects our commitment to Hawaiian language, Christian values, math and English/language arts literacy, intervention, student choice & enrichment, student advocacy, middle school philosophy and professional development of our staff. The schedule also aligns with the high school bell schedule ensuring continuity of course offerings, student mentorships and athletic programs.

The major changes in curriculum include:

Hawaiian language, Christian education, math and English will increase instructional time.

Students who need to build foundational skills will receive support within the instructional day through an intervention period.

Students will have more choices to explore areas of interest throughout the year through the enrichment period.

Programs and supports for social-emotional learning will be embedded in content areas and guided by an adult advocate for every child as well as through guidance classes.

Faculty and staff will have time to engage in professional development within the instructional day.

Students will have time within the school day to socialize and unwind or use the time to catch up on school and/or home work.

Our morning protocol will start at 8:10; attendance will be taken at the start of period 1. Ke Kahua will be offered between 7:30-8:05 and may include: club/team meetings and individual tutoring with teachers during faculty office hours

## Kula Ha'aha'a Schedule

Our master schedule is the least impacted with the new changes and will continue with a 7:45 am start time and a 2:30 pm end time.

- Our schedule provides a well-rounded educational experience that maximizes 21st Century Learning to meet our rigorous E Ola! Learner Outcomes.
- The core instruction is supported by our I mua Block where students receive academic intervention, Hawaiian, and Science instruction every other day.
- We will continue with a 4-day rotation and our popular Pō'akolu Ho'oulu Wednesday learning activities.
- The biggest impact will be with our after school programming, where we may need to adjust our clubs and sports to meet the later after school bus times. We will have those details worked out prior to the start of the school year.
- Kama'aina Kids will continue to provide after school care for families who may need that support.


