



## FOUNDER'S DAY

A day to honor and remember Ke Ali'i Bernice Pauahi Bishop through mele (song), pule (prayer), hula (dance), mo'olelo (stories) and ho'okupu (gifts), the 22nd Founder's Day will be held on December 19 at Ka'ulaheanuikamoku, the High School Gym. School will end at the conclusion of Founder's Day. Aloha/Business attire is requested of all attendees.

High School students are required to wear appropriate dress whites. **Na Kane**: Uniform white long sleeve Kukui print Aloha shirt. Plain white undershirt only. Uniform white, pleated dress pants without cuffs. White belt. White dress shoes (no open-weave or athletic shoes). White, full-length dress socks. Blue sash. Class ring only. **Na Wahine**: Uniform white dress mu'umu'u. Slip required. White dress shoes or sandals with back strap and heel of one-inch or less. Class ring only.

Program Doors open at 9:10 a.m., program begins at 9:30 a.m. A waiting line will form outside of the facility until 9:10 a.m., when the doors are opened. Limited seating is available for parents on a first-come first-serve basis. The main doors will be closed once the program begins and all late arrivals will be directed to a rear entrance to minimize interruption to the program. As we worship Ke Akua and honor our Founder, we ask that you refrain from any applause or leave your seat to take pictures at any time during the service. Overflow Facility Additional seating will be provided in Ke'eaumokupāpa'iahehe (high school dining hall). Parents with young children are encouraged to use this facility.

The program ends approximately 10:45—11:00a.m. All attendees will be asked to remain in the facility until all students are dismissed. MPD officers will be assisting the exit at 'A'apueo & Kula Hwy for an efficient and coordinated exit of all attendees from the campus. Order of dismissal: 1) Student bus riders 2) Students being picked up from the campus 3) Students with parents attending the service, and student-drivers

Student bus riders will board the buses at the gymnasium and depart campus at 11:00 a.m. Bus Pick Up Times : \*Kahului Shopping Ctr: 11:30 am \*War Memorial: 11:35 am \*Kihei Community Center 11:45 am, \*Lahaina: 11:50 am. For student pick up following the program, all non-bus riders (excluding approved high school student drivers) MUST be picked up by 11:15 a.m. Pick-up location for ALL STUDENTS will be in front of Pākī and Konia, at the high school.

## ABOUT ENRICHMENT GRANTS

Ever wonder where the proceeds from Ho'olaule'a go? Here's an explanation:

1. Enrichment Grants exist to support opportunities for KS Maui students that are not funded by Kamehameha School's regular curricular program. Activities enrich the student experience and provide an opportunity for social, mental, and educational growth. Past grant recipients include ES Good News Club Sleepover, Robotics Club, Huaka'i Hele Club, Hawaiian Ensemble and Project Graduation.

2. Enrichment Grants are funded by the previous year's Ho'olaule'a net proceeds. The net proceeds are earmarked for 5% A'apueo Scholarship contribution to Ke Ali'i Pauahi Foundation ("KAPF") 70% High School division, 15% Middle School Division, and 10% for the Elementary Division, however, this formula serves as a guide and is adjusted at the discretion of the Grant Committee to meet the current year's needs/requests.

3. Grants are awarded to current Kamehameha Schools Maui students in grades K – 12 and KSM graduates.

4. Grants are for the current School Year August through July, however, grants will not be awarded for events/activities that have already been completed.

5. Grants are awarded to individuals/clubs/groups who demonstrate resourcefulness, initiative, and an honest attempt to raise funds.

6. Grants are awarded to individuals/clubs/groups who demonstrate their integrity and willingness to assist PTSO with various events, activities, and the annual Ho'olaule'a.

7. Because of the number of requests and the amount available for grants: a) KSM groups and individuals are limited to one award per school year; b) Travelling groups that receive travel assistance are not awarded funding for other expenses; c) Groups that do not travel may apply for non-travel assistance; d) Funding for food and meals will be considered on a special needs basis with case by case review; e) Personal items such as clothing, uniforms, gifts, and spending money are not eligible for enrichment grants; f) Grants are not provided for staff or parents.

**FOOD CHAIR** works under the direction of the Ho'olaule'a Steering Committee (HSC) and works with KSM Food Service on menu items, ordering ingredients, manage manpower for food prep days, recruit and contract food trucks, manage food donation days, guide all KSM classes working with food kuleana.

**NON FOOD CHAIR** works under the direction of the HSC to guide all KSM classes working with non-food assignments including Games & Inflatables, Crafts, Silent Auction, Manpower, Signage, Parking, Vendors, Rummage, Country Store.

**MANPOWER CHAIR** works under the direction of the HSC to man the information tent, provide information to all attendees, provide assistance to Vendor and Parking Committees, provide assistance to grade levels needing manpower, assign workers that aren't assigned to a spot (show up on the day of the event unassigned), reassign workers that aren't appropriately dress, manage the manpower sheets, collect sign in sheets from the various grade levels Ho'olaule'a Chairs and turn in to the office at the end of the day.

**SPONSOR CHAIR** works under the direction of the HSC to recruit new sponsors to send letters to previous and new Businesses and individuals, work with event Sponsors, Provide promised benefits dependent on level of sponsorship, recognize Sponsors, Mahalo letter, certificate, submit names to PR Chair for inclusion in the Maui News Mahalo ad.
