Ka pili ‘ana me nā mea kahiko

Connecting to the things of our past

‘O ka **MAKAWALU**, ‘o ia ke kilo a me ke kālailai ‘ana i kekahi mea mai nā kuana‘ike ‘oko‘a i mea e loa‘a mai ai ka ‘ike kūhohonu a me nā hopena maika‘i. He kōkua nō ia no mākou, nā limahana o Kamehameha, ma ka ho‘olilo ‘ana i nā keiki, ‘o lākou ka makakoho, no lākou nā hua me nā hopena o kā kākou hana. ‘O ka pa‘u mau ‘ana a nā limahana e ho‘okō nei i ia mākia o ke Kula ‘o Kamehameha me ko mākou mau hui pakanā a me nā ‘ohana nō ho‘i kekahi, pēlā e ‘oi aku ai ka maika‘i o ka nohona o nā keiki i kēia mua aku.

Ua piha nā ‘ao‘ao o Makawalu i nā mo‘olelo o ka pilina me nā mea kahiko. Ma kēlā makahiki kālā i hala aku nei, ua puka akula kākou mai loko mai o nā ‘inea o ka wā ma‘i ahulau, a ua piha nō ho‘i ‘o loko i nā mana‘olana no kēia mua aku. Ma muli o ia hana, ua ho‘āla ‘ia nā pilina me nā hana ku‘una e kōkua ana iā kākou e ho‘okō i ka makemake a Ke Ali‘i Pauahi no ke ola pono ‘ana o ka lāhui.

MAKAWALU - the practice of seeking insight and impact through multiple perspectives is strengthened at Kamehameha Schools through our unwavering focus on keeping our keiki at the center of everything we do. We kākou to foster a better future for our keiki through the tireless work of our purpose-driven KS employees, partners and ‘ohana.

'O kēlā makahiki aku nei, FY2021-22, he makahiki ia no **KA PILI HOU 'ANA** o kākou. He mea ho'ohau'oli nō ka hui hou 'ana o kākou he alo a he alo, no ke kūka'i mo'olelo a me ka ho'oikaika pū 'ana i ko kākou lāhui.

Ma ko kākou mau kahua kula, ua hau'oli nā haumāna i ka launa hou 'ana ma loko a ma waho o ka lumi papa. Ua 'ākoako kākou ma nā hanana ku'una i aloha nui 'ia, a ua ho'omaika'i 'ia nō ho'i ka holomua a nā haumāna. Ua komo nā kumu i nā papahana ho'oikaika kumu, i pa'a ke kahua ho'ona'auao no kā kākou mau keiki, 'o ia kekahi kahua 'oi po'okela o ka honua a puni.

Ma 'ō ma 'ane'i o ka pae 'āina, ua pili hou kākou me nā kaiaulu, nā pakanā, nā hoaloha, a me nā hoa 'ē a'ē, ma ke alu like 'ana ma nā papahana ho'oholomua i ke kūlana o ka Hawai'i. Ua ho'onui 'ia nā pilina pakanā no ka pono o nā keiki Hawai'i, ua kōkua 'ia nā 'ōnaehana ho'oulu mea'ai kūloko, a ua kāko'o 'ia nā alaka'i 'ōiwi ma kā lākou hana i loko o nā kaiaulu me nā kaiahome.

I ka nānā 'ana aku i mua, ua maopopo le'a, 'o nā ha'awina a me ka holomua o kēlā makahiki aku nei, he mea ia i ho'opili iā kākou kekahi me kekahi, a he mea ia i 'oi aku ai ka ikaika a me ka ho'omanawanui o kākou, i mākaukau ho'i kākou ke hiki mai nā ālaina o kēia mua aku. A he ho'omaopopo nō ho'i ia e pūlama make'e loa i ka po'e me nā pilina e pōmaika'i ai kēia ola kanaka 'ana o kākou.



Expanding access to early education

KS' new Kikiwelawela Preschool strives to meet high demand for preschool in Ko'olaupoko.

Ma Malaki o ka makahiki 2022, ua wehe 'ia ke kanakolu o nā kahua kula kamali'i o Kamehameha, ma ka pa'a pono 'ana o 'elua lumi papa hou ma ka hale pule 'o St. Ann, e ho'olako ana he kanahā hou noho no nā kamali'i o Ko'olau. Aia 'elua hou kula kamali'i Kamehameha ma kahi kokoke, 'o ia ho'i, ma He'eia kekahi, a ma Kahalu'u kekahi a'e, a he 134 noho haumāna o nā kula 'ekolu, ke ho'ohui pū 'ia.

'O ka wehe 'ia 'ana o ke Kula Kamali'i ma Kikiwelawela, he holomua iki wale nō ia ma ka 'imi 'ana o ko Kamehameha e ho'olako a lawa nā noho kula kamali'i no nā haumāna o Ko'olaupoko, kahi e nele nei ho'okahi hapalua o nā haumāna i ka noho kula kamali'i 'ole. A ma muli o ka nui 'ana a'e o ka po'e mea keiki e kali ana i nā noho kula, ua wehe 'ia 'elua lumi papa hou ma Kikiwelawela ma 'Aukake no ka makahiki kula 2022–2023.

'O ka mea nui na'e, 'o ke kula ma Kikiwelawela, he hō'oi'a i ka ho'ohiki a me ka holomua o KS i ke kākō'o 'ana i ka pahuho-pu o ka Moku'āina 'o Hawai'i—i pa'a ma ke kāmāwai ma 2020, ma ka pila ACT 46—e ho'olako i nā noho kula kamali'i no nā keiki a pau o Hawai'i. A ma ke kūlia 'ana o ko KS e ho'okō i ka nu'ukia a Pauahi, ke 'imi 'ia nei nō nā ala kūpono e kākō'o ai i nā haumāna ma ka hāpai 'ana a'e i ke kūlana o ka lāhui.

In March 2022, KS opened its 30th preschool site with two new classrooms at St. Ann Church, adding 40 preschool seats for Ko'olau haumāna. KS currently operates two other preschools nearby — another in He'eia and one in Kahalu'u — offering a combined capacity of 134 seats.

The new Kikiwelawela Preschool is a humble step in KS' quest to help meet the demand for early learning in the Ko'olaupoko region, where two keiki compete for every early learning seat. With each preschool adding to its waitlist each year, KS opened two additional classrooms at Kikiwelawela in August for the 2022 to 2023 school year.

More importantly, Kikiwelawela represents and builds upon KS' commitment to support the state of Hawai'i's 10-year goal – established in 2020 through Act 46 – to provide universal access to affordable early learning for all children in Hawai'i. As KS strives to fulfill the vision of Ke Ali'i Pauahi, we will continue to look for meaningful ways to invest in Hawai'i's children to uplift the lāhui.

Our framework: E Ola!

‘O nā keiki ka mea nui ma nā hana a pau ma Ke Kula ‘o Kamehameha. Ma nā kahua kula ‘ekolu a me nā kula kamali‘i he 30 ka nui, ‘o kā mākou pahuhopu ka ho‘oulu ‘ana i nā haumāna ma loko o nā honua ‘oi po‘okela o ka ho‘ona‘auao i kū i ke ‘ano Hawai‘i, i lilo lākou i mau haumāna pa‘a o ko lākou kahua mauili Hawai‘i a e kōkua ana ma ke ‘ano he ‘ōiwi alaka‘i ma ko lākou mau kaiaulu pono‘ī. ‘O ia ke kālaimana‘o e alaka‘i ana i kā mākou hana, i kapa ‘ia ‘o E Ola!

Ke mau nei nō ka ho‘okā‘oi aku i nā ‘ōnaehana ho‘oikaika a loiloi kumu a me ka ho‘olauka‘i a ho‘omohala ‘ana i ka papa ha‘awina. ‘Ānō, no ke 92% o nā kumu a me ke 83% o ka papa ha‘awina, ua kū i nā koina o E Ola! He 94% o nā haumāna papa 12 e puka ana, ua loiloi ‘ia a ua hō‘ike maila nō i ko lākou ho‘okō i nā pahuhopu o E Ola!

Keiki are at the center of everything we do at Kamehameha Schools. Across our three K–12 campuses and 30 preschools, our goal is to inspire learners who are nurtured in world-class Hawaiian culture-based learning environments, grounded in their Hawaiian identity, and contribute to their communities as ‘ōiwi leaders. We refer to this as our E Ola! framework, and this philosophy guides our approach.

We continue to refine E Ola!-aligned educator growth and evaluation systems and expand curriculum mapping and development. Currently, 92% of educators meet E Ola! expectations and 83% of curricula are aligned to E Ola! Assessments show 94% of graduates demonstrating E Ola! at the end of their senior year.

Innovation in action

We witness E Ola! in action every day across our campuses as kumu innovate new lessons and educational experiences that nurture haumāna to learn and grow.



Top Left: In April 2022, KS’ Ho‘okahua Cultural Vibrancy division hosted the Hui ‘Ōpio o ka Pākīpika Hawai‘i-Micronesia Virtual Student Exchange, bringing together more than 50 haumāna from KS Kapālama Middle School, Yap Catholic High School, and Xavier High School on the island of Chuuk. Students met virtually to share mele and presentations about their island homes and the environmental challenges they face. The exchange nurtured relationships beyond the pae ‘āina to increase keiki’s global competency and awareness of oceanic identity shared amongst Pacific communities.

Top Middle: KS Maui Kumu Kui Gapero and Ulu Shiraishi established Hālau ‘Ōiwi, a pilot learning model founded with the mana‘o of traditional Hawaiian ways of learning – ma ka hana ka ‘ike, or through doing one learns – as part of their work with Kālaimo‘ohēle, which is the innovation engine of the school. This experiential approach personalizes learning for each haumāna, giving them voice and choice in their education.

Participants had the option to engage in huaka‘i at 11 ‘āina-based learning sites from Hale‘iwa to Mokauea, and attend some of the 47 virtual, in-person or hybrid learning and wellness sessions led by 60 presenters from the community and extended KS ‘ohana, including multiple alumni.

Nurturing Hawai‘i’s keiki

From ‘āina to ‘opu, increasing ‘ono and access to poi



“O ka pahuhopu a mākou, e ‘oi aku ka nui o ka ho‘oulu a me ke kālepa ‘ana i nā meaulu Hawai‘i, a e lilo hou ka ‘ai ‘ana i ka mea‘ai Hawai‘i ku‘una i mea ma‘amau no kākou. ‘O ka pāhana ‘o “Poi for the People” kekahi hana e ho‘okō nei i ia pahuhopu o ka Community and ‘Āina Resiliency group o Kamehameha.

Aia he mau haumāna wahine ma KS Maui, na lākou i ho‘olālā i lā hana poi no ka lā lawelawe kula. Kapa ‘ia ia pāhana ‘o “Poi for the Pēpē” a ho‘omākaukau ‘ia he ‘eke poi na kēlā me kēia haumāna kula kamali‘i KS ma Maui. Lana ka mana‘o o ia po‘e wāhine ē ho‘iho‘i ‘ia ke kalo i kona kūlana, ‘o ia ka ‘ai pono o ka lāhui kanaka.

Ma ia pāhana i ho‘oloko ‘ia ai he mea‘ai kūpono na nā kamali‘i, ua ‘ike ‘ia nō ho‘i ke ‘ano alaka‘i o nā haumāna ‘ōpio, a ua ho‘oikaika ‘ia ka ‘ōnaehana mea‘ai—i mea e kō ai ka nu‘ukia ‘o ka holomua o ka lāhui.

We aim to increase purchasing and production of culturally significant crops and normalize the consumption of Native Hawaiian foods. The KS Community and ‘Āina Resiliency group’s “Poi for the People” effort is part of this strategy.

Highlights include haumāna wāhine leaders at KS Maui, who used a campus in-service day to mill poi for every KS preschool student on Maui. Calling the project “Poi for the Pēpē,” these wāhine hope to return kalo to its rightful place as the staple and highly nutritious food of kānaka.

These bags of poi represent more than an opportunity to feed keiki with traditional healthy mea ‘ai. It directly reflects the efforts by KS to develop ‘ōiwi leaders, strengthen Hawai‘i’s food systems, and realize its vision of a thriving lāhui.

KeikiDesks: Supporting learning beyond the classroom

In partnership with Hawai‘i Children’s Action Network and Innovate Hawai‘i, KS delivered more than 10,000 KeikiDesks to public school haumāna across O‘ahu. The portable desks, funded by KS and provided to families for free, enabled keiki like He‘eia Elementary School student Kingston Litfee-Markham (pictured) to create a workspace of their own to learn, imagine and grow at home.

Sustaining food, farmers and communities

Sumida Farms has grown watercress on ‘Āina Pauahi for nearly 100 years.



Mai ka mahina ‘ai a i ke pākaukau, he māhele ‘o KS o ka ‘ōnaehana mea‘ai, a he alaka‘i ko‘iko‘i nō ho‘i ma ka mālama ‘ana i ia ‘onaehana. He 116,000 a ‘oi mau ‘eka ‘āina mahi ‘ai o KS e noho kahu nei, a mai ia mau ‘āpana ‘āina i hua mai ai he 22 miliona paona mealu i kēlā makahiki aku nei, he \$27 miliona ka waiwai. ‘O ka po‘e mahi ‘ai ma nā ‘āina Pauahi, he ho‘oulu i nā mealu Hawai‘i, nā lau‘ai me nā hua‘ai, a he hānai holoholona ka hana.

He mahi lēkō ‘o Sumida Farms ma ‘Aiea, ‘o lākou kekahi pakanā mahi ‘ai lō‘ihi o ka ho‘olimalima ‘āina KS. Ua komo ‘ehā hanauna o ko lākou ‘ohana ma ka mālama ‘ana i ia ‘oihana, a ua eo mai nei iā lākou ka makana 2022 SmallBiz Editor’s Choice Award no ka ‘oihana mahi ‘ai mai Hawai‘i Business Magazine.

‘O ke kākō‘o i nā mahi ‘ai kūloko e like me Sumida Farms kekahi hana e hō‘ike ana i ke kūpa‘a o Ke Kula ‘o Kamehameha i ka ho‘onui i ka ho‘oulu mea‘ai kūloko, a pēlā nō ho‘i e ho‘oi-kaika ai i ka ‘ōnaehana ho‘oulu mea‘ai o Hawai‘i e hānai ana i nā keiki o ia hanauna aku, ia hanauna aku.

From farm to table, KS is a part of the entire food value chain and plays a unique leadership role in supporting a resilient food system in Hawai‘i. KS stewards more than 116,000 acres of agricultural land across Hawai‘i that produced more than 22 million pounds and nearly \$27 million worth of local food last year. Farmers on ‘Āina Pauahi grow a variety of Native Hawaiian crops, vegetables and orchards, and raise livestock.

Sumida Farm, one of KS’ longest-standing agricultural tenants, has been growing watercress for four generations in ‘Aiea and was recently honored with the 2022 SmallBiz Editor’s Choice Award in Agriculture from Hawai‘i Business Magazine.

Supporting local growers like Sumida Farms reflects KS’ commitment to increasing local food production, which will, in turn, help foster a resilient food system in Hawai‘i that nourishes and sustains keiki for generations.

HIRING NOW: Revitalizing Hawai‘i’s economy one job at a time

Ua puka mai ‘o HIRING NOW mai ke ku‘ikahi ‘ana o ka Chamber of Commerce Hawai‘i me Hawai‘i News Now a me Ke Kula ‘o Kamehameha. He fea hai limahana ia me ka papa hō‘ike‘ike pūnaewele o nā kūlana hana—he mau lako no ka ho‘onōhīe ‘ana i ke ka‘ina hana hai limahana no nā ‘oihana mea ho‘olimalima o KS ma ka wā o ka ma‘i ahulau COVID-19, he wā pa‘akikī ia o ka loa‘a ‘ana o ka limahana kūpono.

Mai Nowemapa, 2021, a hiki i Iune, 2022, ua ‘e‘e ka po‘e e ‘imi ana i ka hana ma HIRING NOW no ka nānā ‘ana i nā kūlana hana ma nā ‘oihana mea‘ai, pāheona, ho‘ona‘auao, olakino, a pēlā aku.

Ua kōkua ‘o HIRING NOW i nā kaiaulu, nā ‘oihana, a me nā kānaka o Hawai‘i i pilikia i ka ‘īnea nele kālā o ka wā ma‘i ahulau. Ma ke kākō‘o ‘ana i nā ‘oihana mea ho‘olimalima o KS, pēlā e ho‘oikaika ai ko KS i nā kaiaulu, kahi e noho, hana, a holomua ai nā kama‘āina.

New program connects KS’ 2,000+ tenants with job seekers statewide.

In partnership with the Chamber of Commerce Hawaii and Hawaii News Now, KS launched HIRING NOW, a virtual job fair and online job board that streamlined the hiring process for KS tenants amid the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, when finding quality staff was a significant challenge.

From November 2021 through June 2022, HIRING NOW connected job seekers with opportunities in industries that support thriving communities, including food systems, creative industries, education, healthcare and more.

HIRING NOW helped Hawai‘i’s communities, businesses and people recover from the economic hardships caused by the pandemic. By supporting the survival and success of KS’ tenants with programs like this one, KS strives to create vibrant communities where kama‘āina have every opportunity to live, work and thrive.

Strengthening Hawai‘i’s food systems

KS is honored for cultivating ‘āina resiliency.

Ma Pepeluali 2021, ua ho‘okumu ‘ia e Ke Kula ‘o Kamehameha he waihona kālā no ke kāko‘o ‘ana i ka ‘ōnaehana mea‘ai o Hawai‘i, he \$10 miliona ka nui, no ke kōkua ‘ana i nā ‘oihana ho‘oulu, ha‘aliu, ho‘omalele, a hō‘ili‘ili mea‘ai e ‘imi nei i ka ‘ae‘oia mea‘ai o Hawai‘i nona pono‘ī. Ma 2022, ua mahalo mai ka Hawai‘i Venture Capital Association i ia hana lokomaika‘i ma ke koho ‘ana iā Kamehameha, ‘o ia ka mea ho‘opukapuka o ka makahiki.

E ho‘ohana ‘ia ia waihona kālā no ke kāko‘o ‘ana i nā ‘oihana e ho‘onui ana i ka mea‘ai hā‘ehuola no ke kaiulu. Ma ia hana e ‘ike ‘ia ai ke kūpa‘a o KS ma ka ho‘oikaika ‘ana i ka ‘ōnaehana ho‘okele waiwai o Hawai‘i, ma ka haku ‘ana he mau kūlana hana hou.

‘O ka ha‘awina kālā mua loa, he \$300,000, ua hā‘awi ‘ia i ka Hawai‘i ‘Ulu Cooperative. No nā kānaka mahi ‘ai nō ia ‘oihana, a ke ho‘ā‘o nei lākou e ho‘olaulaha i ka mahi ‘ana a me ka ‘ai ‘ana i ka ‘ulu.


Kamehameha Schools established a \$10 million Hawai‘i Food Systems Fund in February 2021 to support local food producers, processors, distributors and aggregators, helping Hawai‘i become more self-sufficient. In 2022, the Hawaii Venture Capital Association recognized this historic investment by naming KS its Investor of the Year.

The new fund will allow KS to increase its direct investments in enterprises aiming to make healthy food more accessible. It also reflects KS’ renewed commitment to building a resilient economy with new jobs and career pathways to help the lāhui thrive.

Hawai‘i Food Systems Fund’s inaugural investment of \$300,000 went to Hawai‘i ‘Ulu Cooperative. The farmer-owned business on Hawai‘i Island is working to revitalize ‘ulu (breadfruit) as a viable crop and dietary staple by empowering farmers to scale up production.


Kamehameha Schools is a private charitable educational trust endowed by the Will of Hawaiian Princess Bernice Pauahi Bishop (1831-1884), the great-granddaughter and last direct descendant of King Kamehameha I.

During her lifetime, Princess Pauahi witnessed the rapid decline of the Native Hawaiian population. She knew that education would be key to the survival of her people, and in an enduring act of aloha, she bequeathed to them a precious gift — 375,000 acres of ancestral lands of the royal Kamehameha family and instructions to her trustees that the “rest, residue and remainder of my estate” be used to establish the Kamehameha Schools.

Today, Ke Ali'i Pauahi's legacy continues to advance her desire to restore her people through education.

Educational Spending

During fiscal year 2021-2022, Kamehameha Schools spent \$490 million from its endowment on education, representing 4.0% of the five-year average market value of the endowment for the year, also referred to as “spend rate”. KS targets a 4% spend rate to provide for stability and financial equilibrium over time. In close alignment with the policy, the average spend rate for the last five and 10 years was 3.9%.







Kamehameha Schools' mission is 97% supported by its endowment with 3% being supported by tuition, net of financial aid. The endowment was valued at \$15.1 billion as of June 30, 2022. A globally diversified financial assets portfolio of \$10.4 billion, and Hawai'i real estate representing \$4.8 billion at fair market value comprise the endowment's value.



INVESTMENT RETURNS


The goal of Kamehameha Schools' endowment is to provide superior risk-adjusted long-term returns to support its mission in perpetuity. 



Class of 1972 raises \$50K+ for 50



Throughout 2022, **Deborah Lau Okamura KSK'72** and **Suzanne Peterson KSK'72**, known by classmates as “Debbie and Sue,” led the charge as their class scholarship representatives to accomplish the goal of raising \$50,000 toward their class and other Pauahi Foundation scholarships in celebration of the Kamehameha Schools Class of 1972’s 50th reunion.

Their collective passion is fueled by their gratitude to Ke Ali'i Pauahi and the incredible stories from their scholarship recipients, including one of Okamura’s favorites about a teenage, single mother who applied for financial assistance through the Pauahi Foundation, down and discouraged, ready to give up on school. Okamura recounts that when this young woman got home, “Her mom passed her an envelope and guess what? It was the Pauahi Foundation letter saying that we had awarded her a scholarship! This was early, so we didn’t have very much money to give her (from our class scholarship endowment) but it’s not always about the money. It was about timing.”

“She felt it was a sign that it was meant for her to continue. Now, 20 years have passed, she’s a nurse pursuing advanced degrees, and her baby is now a fabulous young lady who is 17. So that small gift has such an impact.”

Peterson adds about the Kamehameha Schools Class of 1972 Scholarship: “We set up our criteria to help kids that have really struggled, but they’ve also worked really hard and are resilient. We want to give them hope to succeed, and find that when they receive the scholarship, they’re motivated to give back. It’s really a beautiful circle.”

The KS Class of 1972 rallied together and exceeded their goal by raising \$56,000 – the gift of a future and education from a class passionate about keeping Ke Ali'i Pauahi’s legacy alive.

Living the dream, thanks to generous donors

Cheyenne Bajo KSK'21 is focused on her sophomore year at New York University as the inaugural recipient of the Rebecca Kunipo Ching Scholarship. Her life today is dramatically different from her childhood, when she lived out of a car with parents who were grappling with substance abuse before being fostered by her grandparents – something Bajo is eternally grateful for.

She is living her dream thanks in large part to Ke Ali'i Pauahi's vision, a Kamehameha Schools education and the Ching 'ohana and many other generous donors who make it possible for a low-income, first-generation college student like herself to attend a prestigious university and defy the odds.

"These scholarships matter, and this Foundation means so much, not only to me but to so many other kids," Bajo says. "I am a testament that people care that much about what happens to the leaders of our future that they're willing to give and put in the resources to propel our society forward."

Pamela Ching KSK'77 epitomizes the generosity described by Bajo. In 2021, Ching established a scholarship in her mother's name to benefit Native Hawaiian students pursuing careers in public health to recognize her mother's legacy of hard work and perseverance.

Her mother, Rebecca Kunipo Ching, was raised by a hānai family and came from humble beginnings. She was a promising student, but for financial reasons had to forgo furthering her education and began working at age 17 for the Hawai'i Department of Health. She served the Territory and eventually the State for nearly 40 years, supporting programs benefitting women and children. Her tenure at the DOH would leave an indelible mark on her daughters, **Donna Ching KSK'73** and Pamela, as both pursued ca-

reers in public health: Donna as a public health nurse and certified pediatric nurse practitioner, and Pamela as senior research epidemiologist with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Like the Ching 'ohana, Bajo aspires to return to her community and serve by opening a pediatric endocrinology clinic to combat Type 1 diabetes, a "silent" disease that many of Hawai'i's youth, including Bajo, struggle with. Bajo hopes that her life can encourage and inspire other aspiring 'ōiwi leaders.

"Mahalo for making my dreams come true," Bajo says to the scholarship donors. "You have entrusted the very best of this generation with the hope and faith needed to become the best and brightest versions of ourselves; thank you for allowing me to be a part of this legacy."

Bajo was also awarded the Kamehameha Schools Class of 1962 and Kalino Foundation Need-Based Scholarships this year.




