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Congressman Kai Kahele Visits KS Maui

U.S. Rep. Kai Kahele held constituent meetings on Maui this month, visiting with Mayor Mike Victorino's office, Maui Memorial Medical Center, J. Walter Cameron Center, Hui No Ke Ola Pono — and our own KS Maui campus.

Kahele was greeted upon arrival by Māhele Lalo (K-5) haumāna with protocol arranged by Kumu Hulali DeLima and Kumu Naupaka Joaquin. Fifth-grader Mason Reyes, who has a passion for history and the Kamehameha dynasty, gave the representative a short tour of the Māhele Lalo campus and the

history behind the names of each building. Kahele met with student leaders from Māhele Luna (6-12), speaking about the importance of 'ōiwi leadership in our community.



Haumāna and Kumu Rally to Mālama Water Supply

On the same day that US Representatives Kai Kahele and Ed Case announced they were introducing federal legislation to close the Navy's Kapūkakī (Red Hill) facility, kumu and haumāna gathered along Kula Highway in solidarity with thousands of families displaced by the ongoing water contamination crisis. The facility houses underground fuel tanks responsible for water contamination threatening O'ahu's water supply.

Kumu and haumāna held signs expressing, "Aloha 'āina," "Mālama Kapūkakī," and "Ola i ka wai." In addition, Kumu Henohea Kāne and Kumu Kēhau Lucas offered haumāna a chance to have t-shirts printed with the "Ola i ka wai" design.





Kumu Hulali DeLima Launches Pu'u Mu'umu'u Project

While the classic aloha shirt is ubiquitous with Aloha Fridays, it's rare these days to see the mu'umu'u of our kūpuna worn proudly. That's where Kumu

Hulali DeLima's Pu'u Mu'umu'u project comes in, and the introduction of Mu'umu'u Mondays at Māhele Lalo (K-5).

"We want to normalize this attire today," she says.

Girls can borrow a mu'umu'u — all of which have been donated — and wear lole that resembles the attire of their kūpuna. "In turn they start to act like them, walk like them, be like them," says DeLima. "It's really cute! It is a big confidence booster."
