- All drive-thru / drive-in events may be enjoyed in personal vehicles only. Trailers, motorcycles, or multi-axle vehicles will not be permitted on campus.
- Lū'au check-in will proceed at Kekūhaupi'o Parking Structure; clearance for vehicles is 6' 8" feet.
- All events will proceed as planned unless the events are canceled by State or Local officials.
- Tickets will not be mailed ahead of events. Your email confirmation/QR Code will be required for check-in.
- There will be no consumption of alcohol on campus at any time.
- Security and/or event staff reserve the right to refuse entry, or ask any guest to leave campus, if they refuse to abide by safety guidelines.
- Cancellations may only be made through Alumni Relations office at (808) 534-8172 or (808) 534-8283. Refunds or cancellation requests will not be accepted after May 7, 2021. Refunds will be processed beginning June 1.
