- Potential sites for affordable multi-family rental housing
- Up to 16 acres designated for King Kamehameha III Elementary School and educational needs
- Potential commercial spaces aligned with community needs and a regenerative economy
- Potential sites for affordable single-family housing
- Potential new evacuation routes and increased connectivity throughout Lahaina

This exploratory conceptual rendering is shaped by community input, ongoing discussions, and ideas from potential partners and collaborators.

What could King Kamehameha III Elementary School in Lahaina look like?




- On-site parking and drop-off area to alleviate traffic and improve safety
- Ample space to expand school for future needs
- Water could come from previous KIII allocation
- State of the art building materials and construction
- Safely located outside of the tsunami zone
- Facility to shelter in place in the event of a major disaster
- Potential restoration resources meant for Lahaina stay in Lahaina

After the feedback form closes, HIDOE's Office of Facilities and Operations will review the report and make a recommendation to HIDOE's leadership that considers such factors as timeline, cost, availability of infrastructure, physical and historical characteristics of the site, fire safety and community sentiment, among others.
