I am grateful to submit another letter of support for Olin Lagon to serve as a Trustee of the Kamehameha Trust. My prior letter dated March 9, 2023, is attached for reference and still stands as a testament of my support.

The Trust's role for Hawaiians is essential yet more communication is required for non-Hawaiian understanding.

Aloha Trustee Selection Judge,

I am honored to advocate for Olin Lagon to be a Kamehameha Schools Trustee at this crucial time in societal challenge and transition. Kamehameha Schools fulfillment of potential is essential for not only Hawaiians but all of Hawai'i.
