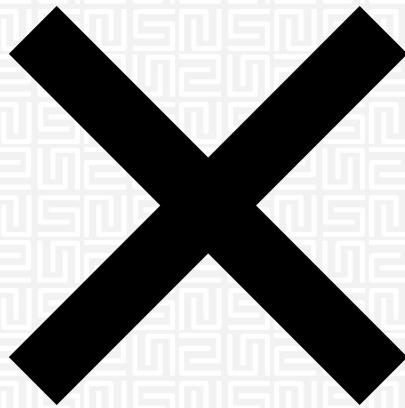

# THE PROBLEM: CIVIC ENGAGEMENT IN CRISIS



- ❑ Hawai'i is last in the nation in voter turnout
- ❑ 53% of registered voters cast ballots in 2018
- ❑ 36% of those eligible to vote cast ballots in 2018
- ❑ 18-26 y/o's are least likely to vote of any age group

# POLITICS IS REPRESENTATION



## Native Hawaiian Representation

- Native Hawaiians make up about 25% of the population
- 11 of 76 sitting State Senators and Reps are Native Hawaiian
- 1 Native Hawaiian Governor has been elected since statehood
- 0 sitting members of our federal delegation are Native Hawaiian

## Female & Youth Representation

- Women ~50% of the state, but hold <math><1/3</math> of the seats at the leg
- Under 30 are >math>1/3</math> of the state, yet just one sitting legislator is <math><30</math>

# EASIER THAN EVER TO VOTE



- ❑ 16 year-olds may pre-register
- ❑ All registered voters who will be 18 by election day will receive a ballot in their mailbox
- ❑ All 18 y/o residents may register at a polling place on election day & vote the same day

# 2020 MATTERS



- ❑ 100+ elected positions (fed., state, county)
- ❑ 2020 presidential election & primaries
- ❑ Elections are won and lost by 1 vote

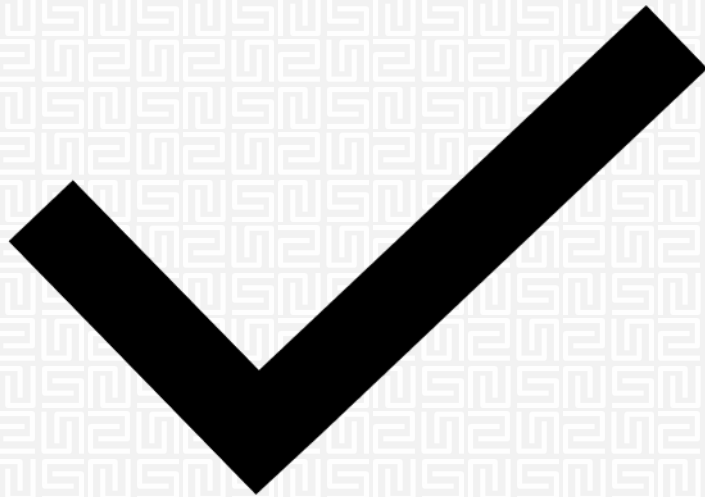
