The loss of our traditional graduation is indeed bitter water to drink, but we will, "I mua Kamehameha ē a lanakila"!

Commencement, with all of its activities, marks the culmination of thirteen years of schooling and a new beginning for your sons and daughters. This is an exciting moment for the graduates, their families and their friends. While we at KS fully understand how important this rite of passage is for our graduates and their 'ohana, we cannot in good conscience hold a traditional graduation ceremony. We would hate to jeopardize the health of any member of our 'ohana, especially our kūpuna. We have instead, created a unique and, one of a kind week-long celebration honoring our graduates. This memo includes a complete list of all commencement activities in which our students and 'ohana will be able to participate. All commencement activities are completely optional. In addition, important information and guidelines for each event is included.

* Note: The above senior events will operate under the strict protocols and guidelines established by the Governor, City & County of Honolulu, CDC, WHO, and our own KS Mālama Ola staff. We kindly ask for everyone's understanding and cooperation in upholdingthese protocols and guidelines.

Seniors are gifted with a specially designed kīhei (a traditional Hawaiian ceremonial garment) in honor of their graduation. If you missed the opportunity to take your Pauahi portrait photo, we will offer a final session during the specified dates above. Sign-up is mandatory to reserve your spot. Students must be dressed in their dress whites (shoes, too!) and come prepared with their completed order form (enclosed) and payment!

Reminder, deadline to register for the Baccalaureate Service, Graduation Drive-Thru Celebration, and Commencement is <u>Monday, May 17 at 8:00 pm</u>. Mai mili 'apa!

As a final reminder, please note that for ALL events students who experience any symptoms of COVID-19 for 1–3 days, even if at home and not missing in-person learning, must provide a doctor's note or negative COVID-19 PCR test collected after the onset of symptoms to Hale Ola prior to the student's return to school or school activities. A doctor's note continues to be required for return following four or more days of illness.

KS SENIOR LAPTOP & SCHOOL PROPERTY DROP-OFF

DATES: Monday, May 24 & Tuesday, May 25

TIME: 8:00 am - 11:00 am & 12:00 pm - 2:00 pm

LOCATION: Kōnia Circle

Seniors/families will be allowed onto campus during any of the designated dates/time to return their KS laptop and any other school property. This drop-off will allow students to return KS items and avoid additional charges on their school accounts for any missing items. Individuals will not be permitted to exit their car at any time while on campus except if retrieving items from their locker. Items to return may include, but are not limited to: textbooks, uniforms, supplies, cameras, costumes, instruments, etc.

What to expect:

- All persons in vehicle must wear a cloth face mask.
- Students may select what works best for their schedule using the event date and times above.
- At <u>no point</u> will a student or family member be allowed outside of their car while on campus
 except if retrieving items from their locker.

GUIDELINES:

- Seniors must enter campus through Main Gate only and bring their ID.
- Only (1) vehicle per graduate will be allowed.
- Items will be exchanged through the front passenger window of vehicle.
- Proper casual dress code attire required. Attire should be in good taste, shirts and footwear required.
- If arriving in a truck, we ask that there be no passengers seated in truck beds.
- Upon entering campus main gate, graduates must clearly place the 11"x17" Name Placard on the car dashboard for easy identification of graduate name when entering Kōnia Circle (provided by KS in mailout forthcoming).
- In the event that you lose or forget your placard, please take a photo of your placard.
- If not already in a case or box, all supplies/items must be bagged (grocery bag, small trash bag, plastic bag, etc.) to turn into department/course.
- Each bagged item must include an identification label attached to bag (4 labels provided by KS in mailout forthcoming).
- Identification label to include: student's first and last name, name of course, kumu and department.

- Please note that students may be assessed for any items returned damaged.
- Once drop-off is complete, please exit campus through Main Gate.

Those graduates who are interested in attending must complete the RSVP above. Seating is limited each evening and online registration is on a first come, first served basis. **Deadline to RSVP is Thursday, April 29th at 9:00pm. NO EXCEPTIONS.** Participation in this event is optional. Failure to comply with the following guidelines and procedures, will result in dismissal from event and may jeopardize participation in other Commencement events.

What to expect:

- All students, guests and staff will wear a cloth face mask at all times.
 - o Face masks must fit properly and cover the nose and mouth.
 - o Face masks may be removed ONLY when actively eating or drinking.

• BEFORE YOU ARRIVE on Campus:

- o Students must complete the Student Wellness Check.
- O Please note that for ALL events students who experience any symptoms of COVID-19 for 1-3 days even if at home and not missing in-person learning must provide a doctor's note or negative COVID-19 PCR test collected after the onset of symptoms to Hale Ola prior to the student's return to school or school activities. A doctor's note continues to be required for return following four or more days of illness.
- o All guests and staff must complete the Guest and Staff Wellness Check
- Students and guests will receive an email after completion to indicate if they are CLEARED to come on campus.
 - If you are NOT CLEARED to come to campus, STAY HOME.

• Upon Arrival

- o All attendees may begin to arrive on campus at 5:30 pm.
- Event parking is at the Ka'ahumanu parking lot ONLY. Those with handicap placards or are getting dropped off may do so at Smith Circle. KS Security will be on hand to assist with parking and traffic.
- All attendees should report immediately to Kōnia Field. No loitering or roaming campus is allowed.

o CHECK-IN

• Check-in tables will be located on the 'Ewa-end of the field tent.

- Attendees temperatures will be taken. <u>IMPORTANT</u>: If a guest has a fever or displays any COVID-19 like symptoms, they will be required to leave.
- Additionally, you will need show proof of your completed **KS Wellness** Check (Green Smiley Face).

• During the Event

- o <u>Seniors and their guests are required to sit together.</u> Only (1) family per table. This will help us keep one another safe while eating and drinking.
- o During the meal service, tables will be ushered in an organized fashion to the food line.
- Seniors and guests will be allowed to move and visit others, as long as 6 ft. social distancing is maintained.
- Soap, water and/or hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol will be available for all attendees and staff to use. We encourage everyone to wash or sanitize hands frequently.

• After the Event

- At the conclusion of the event we ask that you return to your vehicles and leave campus.
 - If you are waiting for your ride, we request that you maintain social distancing at Kōnia Breezeway.
- o No loitering or roaming on campus is allowed.

Baccalaureate, which is traditionally held at Kawaiaha'o Church, will be on our very own campus this year. <u>Due to limited space, this years' service is limited to the graduates of the Class of 2021 only.</u> The service will be live streamed at the link above for 'ohana to enjoy. Mahalo for your cooperation and understanding.

Seniors that are interested in attending MUST complete the registration form: <u>BACCALAUREATE</u> <u>REGISTRATION FORM</u>. <u>Deadline to sign up is Friday, May 17 at 8:00 pm. NO EXCEPTIONS</u>. Each student is responsible for their own transportation to and from the Baccalaureate Service. <u>Participation in this event is optional</u>. Failure to comply with the following guidelines and procedures, will result in dismissal from event and may jeopardize participation in other Commencement events.

What to expect:

- Students and staff must wear a cloth face mask at all times.
 - o Face masks must fit properly and cover the nose and mouth.
- Students must arrive in appropriate attire noted above. All school dress code guidelines, as listed in the Student Handbook, apply.
- Social distancing must be maintained at ALL TIMES.
 - o No hugging, handshaking, etc.

• BEFORE YOU ARRIVE on Campus:

- o Students must complete the Student Wellness Check
- Students will receive an email after completion to indicate if they are CLEARED to come on campus.
 - If you are NOT CLEARED to come to campus, STAY HOME.
- Students cannot drive other students to campus unless attending the event.
- o Parents and guardians may wait in their vehicles for their child.
 - Parking is available at the Ka'ahumanu parking lot or Upper Performing Arts parking lot. However, at no point should parents and guardians exit their vehicle.
 If they need to use the restroom, they must do so off campus.

• Upon Arrival

- o Students may begin to arrive on campus at 9:30 am.
- Student parking is at the Ka'ahumanu parking lot ONLY. Those who are getting dropped off may do so at Smith Circle. Security will be on hand to assist with parking and traffic.
- All students should report immediately to Kōnia Field for check-in. No loitering or roaming campus is allowed.

CHECK-IN

- Student temperatures will be taken. <u>IMPORTANT:</u> If a student has a fever or displays any COVID-19 like symptoms, they will be required to leave. A doctor's note will be required to attend other events.
- Please show proof of your completed KS Wellness Check (Green Smiley Face).
- When cleared, students will receive a wristband and proceed to seating area.

• During the Event

- o Chairs will be placed socially distanced beneath the tent. We kindly request that seniors DO NOT ALTER the seating arrangements.
- No congregational singing will be allowed during the service.
- Soap and water and/or hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol will be available for all attendees and staff to use.

• After the Event

- o At the conclusion of the service, students will be excused in an organized fashion.
- o A small snack will be provided for all students upon leaving the service.
- Students must return directly to their vehicles and leave campus.
 - If students are waiting for their ride, we request that you maintain socially distanced at all times. Students may sit in designated seating areas around Kōnia Breezeway.
- o Absolutely NO loitering or roaming on campus is allowed.

The entire Kapālama Campus will celebrate our graduating Class of 2021 and their families as they take their last ride on campus. Graduates and 'ohana will be allowed onto campus during their designated time to pick up their graduation articles and various *special* makana. We encourage graduates and 'ohana to decorate their cars to celebrate their graduate. Honk those horns! Shake those pompoms! Cheer on your graduate! It's time to celebrate!

A live stream of the drive-thru will be available via the KSK Graduation Website link above, for any extended 'ohana that wish to tune in to the event. Campus access for graduates will begin at 8:45 am. Participation in this event is optional. Failure to comply with the following guidelines and procedures, will result in dismissal from event and may jeopardize participation in Commencement the following day.

What to expect:

- All persons in vehicle must wear a cloth face mask.
- At <u>no point</u> will a student or family member be allowed outside of their car while on campus except when the graduate reaches Kōnia Field to walk across the field.
- Students must arrive in appropriate attire listed above. All school dress code guidelines, as listed in Student Handbook, apply. Attire must be in good taste.
- Wearing lei is allowed.
- *DRIVE-THRU SCHEDULE* Graduates will arrive to campus in waves and alphabetically by LAST NAME. To help with traffic and long lines, graduates must adhere to arriving any time during their allotted timeframe below.

*IMPORTANT: If students/families are uncomfortable with participating, cannot make it on this day, have a fever, or are not feeling well that day, please stay home.

• BEFORE YOU ARRIVE on Campus

- Only (1) vehicle per graduate will be allowed.
- Vehicles used for drive-through MUST be passenger vehicles. Semi-trucks, trucks pulling trailers, flatbeds, busses, or anything similar is NOT allowed.
- If arriving in a truck, we ask that there be no passengers seated in truck beds.
- If multiple graduates decide to carpool, it will be at the discretion of graduate families.

• Upon Arrival

- Seniors must enter campus through Main Gate only and bring their ID.
- Upon entering campus main gate, <u>graduates must clearly place the</u> 11"x17" Name Placard on the car dashboard for easy identification of graduate name when entering Kōnia Circle (provided by KS in mailout forthcoming).
- Please take a photo of your placard and save it on your phone in the event that you lose or forget your placard on day of event.


• During the Event

- All cars will be directed by campus security for traffic flow.
- With the high volume of vehicles and lengthy drive-thru route, please anticipate some traffic and delays. Your patience, cooperation and understanding is greatly appreciated. Please drive with aloha!
- <u>Items will be exchanged through front passenger window of vehicle only.</u>
- Only students and parent/official guardians may pick-up their graduation articles (graduation kīhei and graduation blue satin lei).
- **DRIVE-THRU ROUTE-** Special stops will be made along the way for various makana and graduation articles needed for the Commencement Ceremony the following day.
 - All cars will ENTER AND EXIT through the MAIN GATE.
 - See attached for Drive-Thru Celebration Route.
- PRESENTATION OF THE GRADUATE Upon arrival at Kōnia Field, graduates will be allowed to exit the vehicle and walk across the main stage as their name is called. At that time graduates will receive their graduation articles.
- Graduate should not bring anything when exiting the vehicle.
 - No animals, flammables, signs or anything contraband items.

131st COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

DATE: Sunday, May 30, 2021

Commencement will be held at the Hawai'i Convention Center (HCC). Students and two (2) guests will have the opportunity to celebrate in-person and together as a class. For 'ohana that are unable to attend a live stream of the commencement ceremony will be available via the KSK Graduation Website link above, for any extended 'ohana that wish to tune in to the event.

Due to the size of our event, graduates and their guests will be seated together in pods of three. Seating will be assigned and socially distanced between each family unit. During the presentation of the graduates, the graduate will stand up from their seat to be recognized and receive their diploma from KS Administration. Graduates will sit after receiving their diploma. There will be no walking across the stage by our graduates. This structure is in compliance with the City and County of Honolulu's Tier 3 Structured Event Guidelines where only static events are allowed at HCC at this time. Static events are those in which attendees have an assigned seat, attend the seated event, and leave.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, strict health and safety protocols must be observed by those attending this event. For the safety and security of all guests and graduates, please follow the instructions of the HCC Personnel, KS Personnel, Security, and HPD during and after Commencement. Failure to comply will result in dismissal from the event. Here are the rules as they pertain to our Commencement at the Hawai'i Convention Center.

IMPORTANT HAWAI'I CONVENTION CENTER INFORMATION:

- Please drive carefully and observe traffic regulations in the HCC parking lot.
- Tailgating is not permitted before or after the program.
- No food or drinks are allowed in the Exhibition Hall at any time.
- No aisles can be obstructed.
- All personal items must fit on lap or under the seat.
- No signs or banners allowed.
- No sticks, pipes, or rods.
- No balloons
- No tripods
- No drones
- No laser pointers
- No noisemakers or air horns
- No silly string, confetti or confetti cannons

What to expect:

- All students, guests and staff MUST wear a cloth face mask in addition to a face shield at all times.
 - o Face masks must fit properly and cover the nose and mouth.
 - o Face shields must be wide enough to cover side coverage temple to temple and be long enough to cover the chin.
 - No goggles, safety glasses, etc.
 - o Students and guests without proper face mask and face shield will not be allowed entry into the Exhibition Halls.
- Seating at the event will be pre-assigned by graduates' last name. A seating chart will be provided to senior families as the event nears.
- Graduation kīhei and lei will be picked up at the Drive-Thru Celebration.
 - o Parents and guardians will receive a special note and instructions on how to tie their child's kīhei.

• Before you Arrive at HCC:

- o Students must complete the <u>Student Wellness Check.</u>
- o All guests and staff must complete the Guest and Staff Wellness Check
- o Students and guests will receive an email after completion to indicate if they are CLEARED.
 - If you are NOT CLEARED to come, STAY HOME.

• Upon Arrival

- o Check-in begins at 5:00 pm.
- o Students must arrive in their Special Events Attire (dress whites), graduation kīhei, blue satin lei, KS issued face mask and face shield.
- o Graduates are allowed to wear up to two floral lei of their choice. We kindly ask that the blue satin graduation lei be placed on the top.
 - If choosing to wear a lei po'o, you may wear that in addition to the two lei of your choice.
- o Parking
 - Event parking is limited. Only (1) car per graduate/family allowed.
 - Parking fee will be \$12.00
 - Payment can be made when entering the venue or outside the Exhibition Halls.
 - Payment is encouraged upon arrival to HCC or at the check-in area to help alleviate traffic congestion when exiting the parking lot.

o CHECK-IN

- Graduate and 2 guests must check-in together as a family unit.
- Temperatures will be taken by HCC staff before entering the venue.
 - <u>IMPORTANT:</u> If a student or guest has a fever or displays any COVID-19 like symptoms, they will be required to leave.
- After temperature checks, attendees will make their way to the ground level to check-in as an 'ohana.
 - Check-in tables will be organized in alpha order by graduate LAST NAME in front of the Exhibition Halls.
 - Graduates and guests will need show proof of their completed KS Wellness Check (Green Smiley Face).
- After checking in, graduates and guests must proceed directly to their assigned seats.
 - Please refrain from visiting with other families before, during, and after the event.

• During the Event

- o Graduates and guests are required to sit together at all times.
- o No loitering, socializing, or congregating is allowed.
- o Restrooms are located within the Exhibition Hall.
- O You may take pictures and video from your assigned seat.
- At Kamehameha, commencement ceremonies are conducted with dignity and pride. We believe that catcalling, loud cheering, yelling, and signs detract from the recognition of each student being honored as they stand to be recognized. We ask your support in maintaining the dignity of the ceremony.
- There will be ample video screens in the venue for all guests to enjoy the program.

• After the Event

- o To ensure an orderly dismissal, graduates and guests will be dismissed by the emcee. We ask for your patience in remaining seated until you are dismissed.
- ALL attendees must proceed directly to their vehicles and depart from the venue.
 No loitering or roaming on HCC property is allowed.
- o Reminder, tailgating is strictly prohibited.
- For the safety of our graduates and guests, there will be NO lei greeting allowed BEFORE or AFTER the ceremony on the HCC premises. Mahalo for your understanding and cooperation.
- o Security and HPD will be on hand to maintain and monitor all attendees.


KALAMAKŪALI'I THE ROYAL LAMP

Kamehameha Schools Kapālama marks this special occasion with a kīhei, a traditional Hawaiian garment, gifted to each graduating senior. Having successfully completed our graduation requirements, they have earned the privilege and honor of receiving this special kīhei as a symbol of their passage into the next phase of their lives.

"Kalamakūali'i—The Royal Lamp" was designed by Visual Arts teacher Carl Pao in collaboration with a committee of other high school staff members with expertise in Hawaiian language and culture. The symbols in the design have significance for our school and its location on the heights of Kapālama, the piko (center) of our graduates' formal education over the past few years.

The lamakū, or kukui nut lamp, symbolizes enlightenment or the acquisition of knowledge and wisdom during our graduates' time with us. The four kukui represent each grade level of the high school, joined by a nī'au (coconut midrib) which is anchored in a pōhaku (stone). What we see of the pōhaku is a shape that resembles an 'ahu'ula (shoulder-length feather cloak) that represents Pauahi, our Founder and Benefactress, whose generosity created tremendous educational opportunities for our graduates. The brilliance of the light has grown stronger as they have passed from one grade to the next. We hope that our graduates will continue to add kukui, gaining greater enlightenment in their lives beyond Kamehameha, but always be firmly connected to the piko of Kapālama.

The wavy lines at the bottom of the design represent wai (water), a source of life and knowledge, and symbolize the underground waterway that once flowed through lava tubes and connected Keanakamanō (The Cave of the Shark) Valley at our campus' main gate with Pu'uloa (Pearl Harbor), Oceania and the rest of the world. Our mo'olelo (stories) say that the Hawaiian god Kamohoali'i traveled this waterway in his shark form to Kapālama. The chevron shapes represent a shark's teeth and also the island of O'ahu.
