



A beautiful Hawaiian quilt, "Aloha Ko Kākou Kamali'i" (Love For Our Children) was made specifically for the Kamehameha Schools Hawai'i.


Mrs. Jundale Lauwa'eomakana Quinories, a Hawai'i Island master quilter, designed and sewed this campus quilt funded through Kamehameha Schools' 'Ike Hawai'i Art Consortium.

The quilt measures 144"x114" with significant symbols that represent important values to Kamehameha Schools. The cross reminds us of our beloved Ke Aliʻi Pauahi's Christian faith. The royal crest represents Kaʻahumanu, who was instrumental in sanctioning both the practice and value of Christianity to our Native Hawaiian people. The lehua blossoms represent our native forest in which Kamehameha Schools Hawaiʻi is situated and also represents our beloved Hawaiʻi Island haumāna. The lei maile represents Ke Aliʻi Pauahi's legacy that has provided a rich educational experience for our haumāna. The spears represent the strength and courage of Kamehameha I. The primary border that highlights the entire quilt represents our parents, faculty, staff, and community for their continued love and support toward helping our students to become "good and industrious men and women".

This design represents our class name, Onelau'ena, and the footprints we leave in the sand. The circles incorporate multiple perspectives; they can represent growing or fading depending on which perspective or lens you use to view the world.

The mana'o behind my design is that it represents the growing size of our class from 4th to 12th grades. It also represents the closeness we feel to our friends at varying degrees. The class started small like the triangle and slowly increased with every new student who entered Kamehameha until it reached the black circle. Our friends increased simultaneously, with more and more people in our grade because the more people who entered, the more friends we had. Finally, looking at the inverse, the triangle is our closest friend and one we have known the longest and trusted the most. As it grows outward, the people residing within the boundaries are more friends; these relationships are life long friendships.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT CORDS

Tied to the hīpu'u (knot) of the student's kīhei, a blue cord, named kāhikohala after the light rain that falls upon Kea'au, signifies students who have successfully completed the requirements of an Academic Honors Diploma.

The white cord, named lūhaupua after the gentle breeze of Keaʻau, signifies a student's academic achievement, leadership, and volunteerism as a National Honor Society member of Kamehameha Schools Hawaiʻi.

Named after the rain of Hōpoe in Puna, the kiawelehua silver cord adorns students who have met the requirements for Career Academy Endorsement, which include successful completion of an internship and specialized and advanced coursework in a Career Pathway.


