

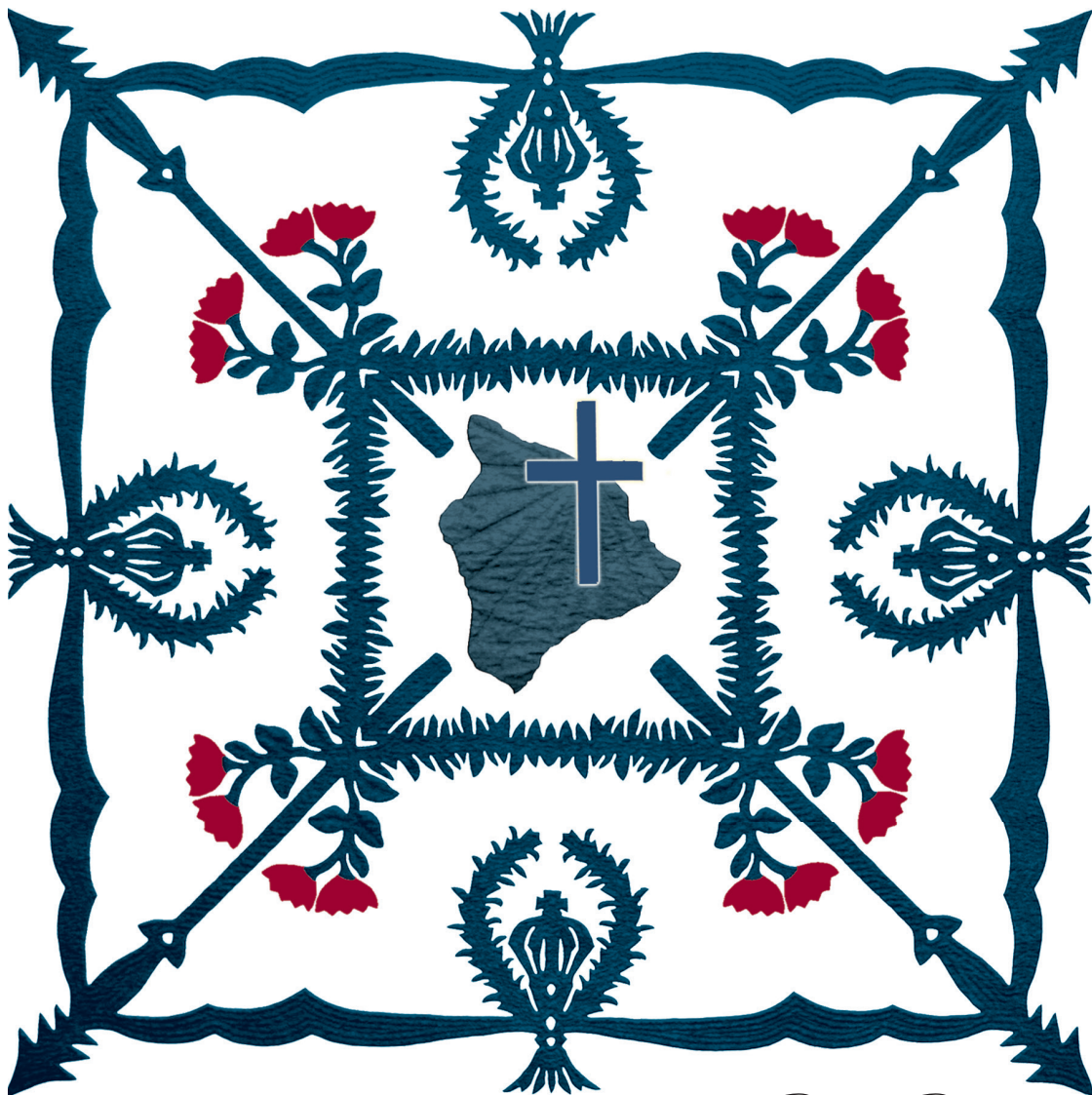

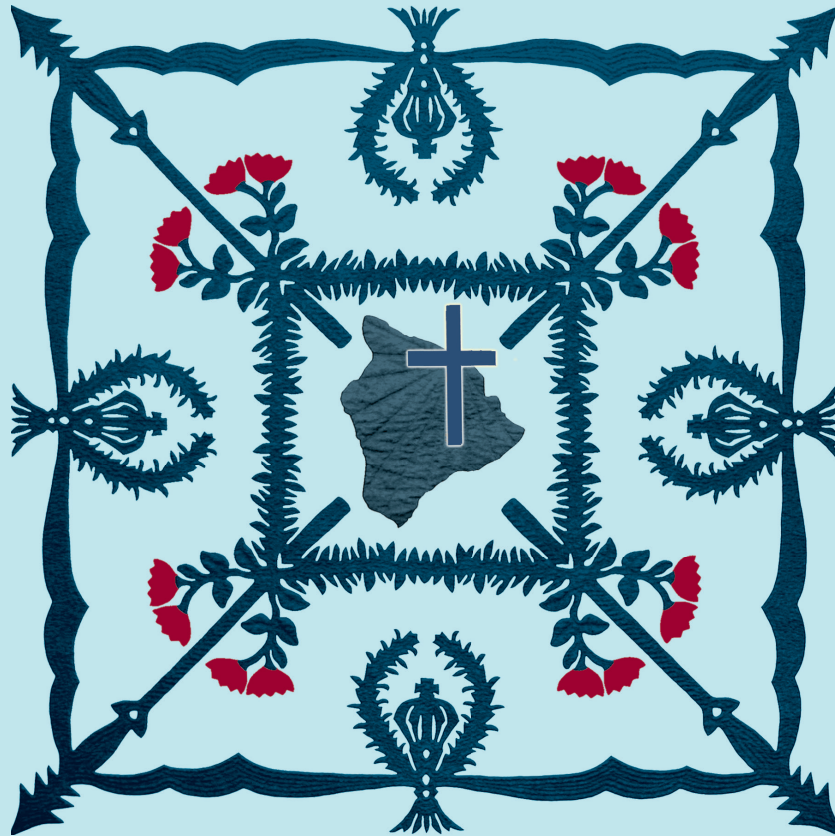

“ALOHA KO KĀKOU KAMALI’I”



**A beautiful Hawaiian quilt, “Aloha Ko Kākou Kamali’i”
(Love For Our Children) was made specifically
for the Kamehameha Schools Hawai’i.**

Mrs. Jundale Lauwa’eomakana Quinories, a Hawai’i Island master quilter, designed and sewed this campus quilt funded through Kamehameha Schools’ ‘Ike Hawai’i Art Consortium.

The quilt measures 144”x114” with significant symbols that represent important values to Kamehameha Schools. The cross reminds us of our beloved Ke Ali’i Pauahi’s Christian faith. The royal crest represents Ka’ahumanu, who was instrumental in sanctioning both the practice and value of Christianity to our Native Hawaiian people. The lehua blossoms represent our native forest in which Kamehameha Schools Hawai’i is situated and also represents our beloved Hawai’i Island haumāna. The lei maile represents Ke Ali’i Pauahi’s legacy that has provided a rich educational experience for our haumāna. The spears represent the strength and courage of Kamehameha I. The primary border that highlights the entire quilt represents our parents, faculty, staff, and community for their continued love and support toward helping our students to become “good and industrious men and women”.

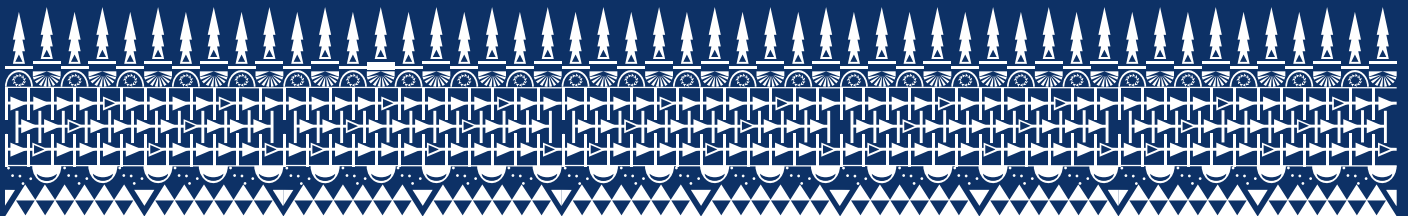
THIS YEAR'S KIHEI DESIGN & MEANING

KA'IWAHO'OKELEWA'A

Today, we proudly present our class design, a visual representation of our journey as students at Kamehameha Schools Hawai'i, woven with meaning and symbolism that reflects our growth, values, and identity.

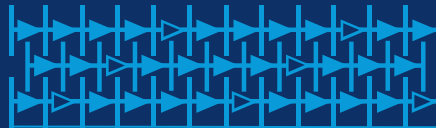
In the Kula Ha'aha'a years, the small triangle in our design represents us as young learners eager, curious, and surrounded by the protective guidance of our school. The larger triangle that encircles the smaller one symbolizes Kamehameha Schools, a nurturing presence that sheltered us and provided a foundation for growth. At that time, we looked up in awe, inspired by those who had come before us.



Kula Waena was a period of change, a challenging transition that introduced new faces, opportunities, and obstacles. Each triangle in this part of the design represents our mind, body, and spirit growth. Vertical lines between these triangles symbolize the challenges that could have hindered our progress but helped us sharpen our skills, build endurance, and carry valuable lessons forward. These experiences shaped us into young adults, solidifying our identity as kanaka and developing our leadership skills.



In Kula Ki'eki'e, the arrows in the design represent our class Ka'iwahookelewa'a, guiding and supporting one another as we navigated these final years together. The circles symbolize the relationships we've formed and how our bonds have grown stronger over time. Each student brought unique strengths as athletes, scholars, and creatives; we created a unified and supportive class together.



At the heart of our design is a triangle representing the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit — a reminder that our journey has been grounded in faith. We recognize that Ke Akua has guided us throughout this journey, giving us strength and purpose as we prepare for the path ahead.




The final element of our design reflects our roots and the foundation we have built over the past 13 years. Outward triangles symbolize the knowledge we will carry with us and share with the world. Inward triangles represent the wisdom gained from our experiences and the memories we will cherish. This design reminds us to honor the legacy of our kūpuna and ali'i while embracing the future we are destined to create.

To our mākua, 'ohana, and kaiāulu, mahalo for the unwavering support that allowed us to grow, thrive, and succeed. As we leave this place to pursue our legacies, we carry the values, memories, and love that have shaped us into who we are today.

Tied to the hīpu‘u (knot) of the student’s kīhei, a blue cord, named kāhikohala after the light rain that falls upon Kea‘au, signifies students who have successfully completed the requirements of an Academic Honors Diploma.

The white cord, named lūhaupua after the gentle breeze of Kea‘au, signifies a student’s academic achievement, leadership, and volunteerism as a National Honor Society member of Kamehameha Schools Hawai‘i.

Named after the rain of Hōpoe in Puna, the kiawelehua silver cord adorns students who have met the requirements for Career Academy Endorsement, which include successful completion of an internship and specialized and advanced coursework in a Career Pathway.

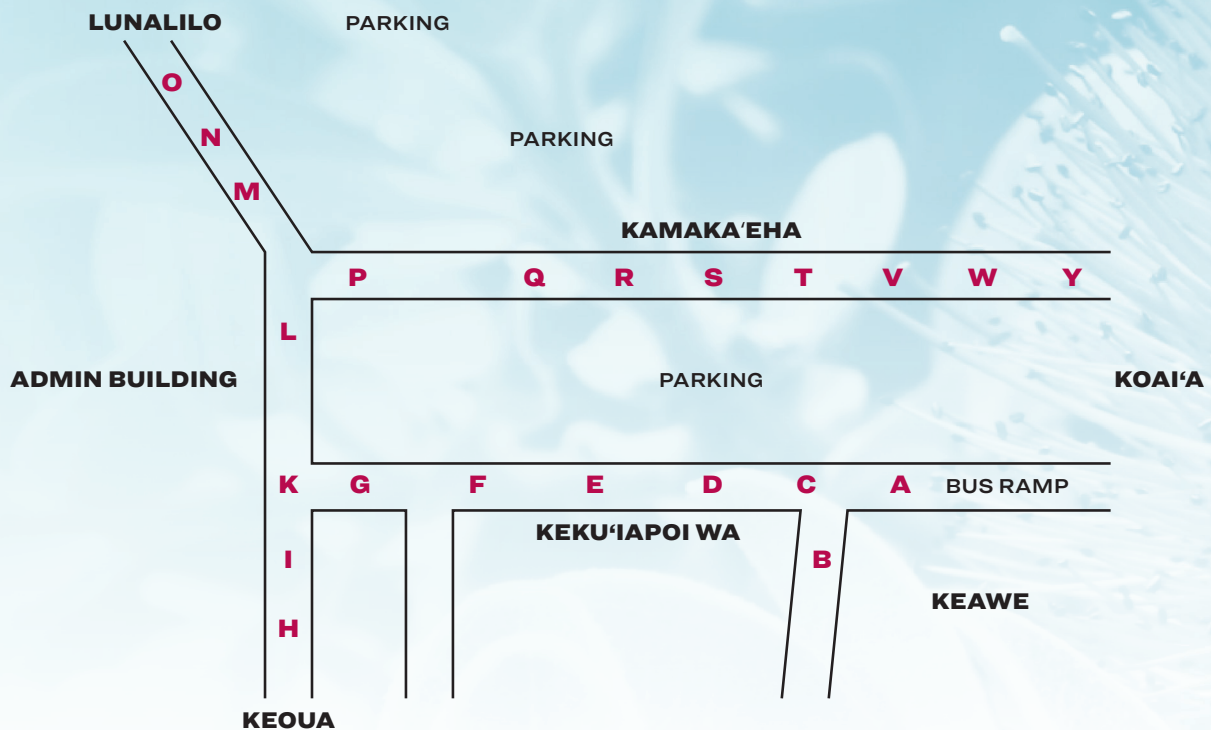
